Prom Expectations

Senior year is the culmination of a student's Holy Trinity career. To add an element of healthy celebration to this experience, our school has established a strong tradition of organizing successful Proms.

The HT Prom Committee works throughout the year to ensure Prom is a memorable experience for graduating students and their guests. To ensure Prom is safe and fun for all who attend, basic expectations have been developed. These expectations are consistent with those that exist for students who are in class or at any school activity. Individuals who are unable or unwilling to meet these expectations cannot attend Prom.

All expectations in the Code of Conduct, as outlined in the Student Handbook, apply to Prom. In particular:

- Students are expected to comply with all school rules, meaning consumption of alcohol and/or drugs prior to or while attending Prom will not be tolerated.
- Students under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs will be suspended and will lose dance privileges for one calendar year. In addition, these students may be subject to charges by police officers on duty at Prom.
- Coats/jackets and bags/purses must be submitted to a check upon arrival.

Prom Safety Tips for Parents/Guardians:

- Ensure that your child has a plan for the evening and that you know the plan.
- Provide emergency contact numbers and your location if you won't be at home.
- Ensure your child has money for taxi or other ride service. Be prepared to pick them up at any time.
- Be aware of destinations after Prom has ended, including after-parties, that your child may attend.
- Take stock of alcohol and prescription medications in your home.
- Know who is driving. If your child is in a limousine, check its policy on alcohol in the vehicle. Encourage seatbelt use.
- Review Prom expectations in the Student Handbook and discuss consequences of violating these expectations.
- Do not rent a hotel room for your child and his/her date and/or friends.
- Communicate with other parents/guardians and school administration.
- Stay up until your child returns home.
